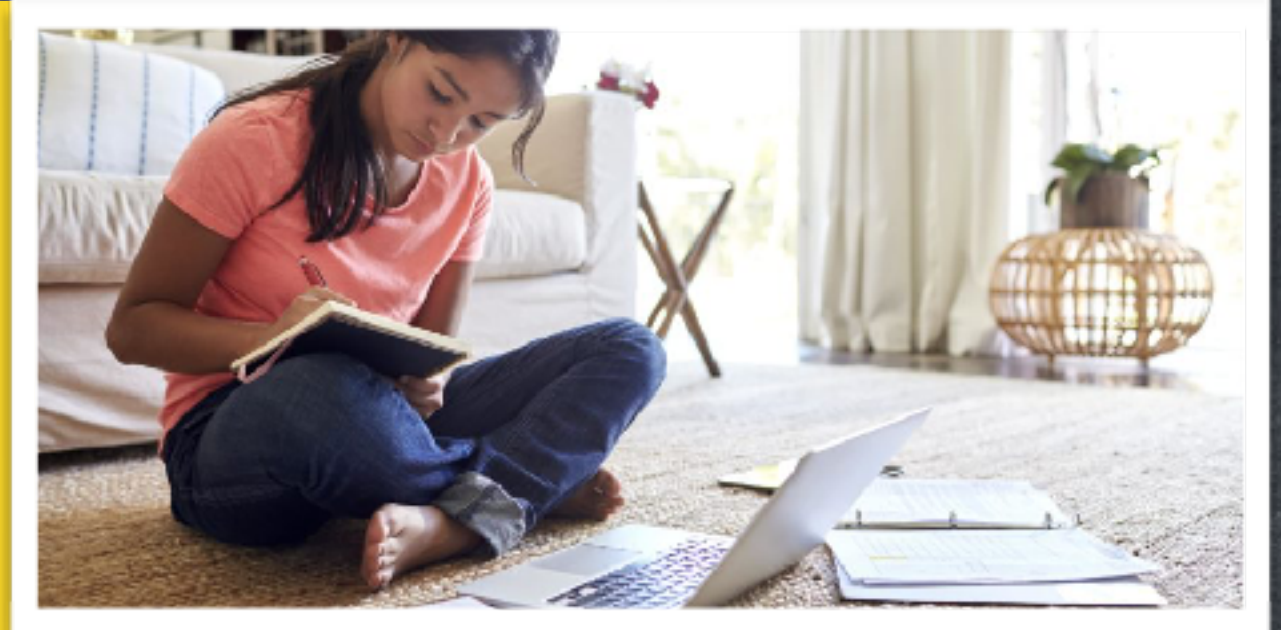


# GRAMMAR 1: The Future

A: Do you have any plans for this evening?

B: Yes, I do. I'm **going to do** my homework. After that, I'm **going to watch** my favorite TV series.



A: What **are you going to do** next weekend?

B: I'm not sure. I think I **will go** hiking with some friends.



A: Where's Ali? He's not in his office.

B: I'll **call** him on his mobile and tell him that you're looking for him.



# GRAMMAR 1: The Future

**Future plan**



**be going to + verb**

**Future probability**



**will + verb**

**Instant decision**



**will + verb**



# GRAMMAR 1: The Future

**Affirmative**



**am/are/is going to + verb**

**will + verb**

**Negative**



**am not/aren't /isn't  
going to + verb**

**will not + verb**

**will not = won't**

# GRAMMAR 1: The Future

Practice: Use *be going to* or *will*

He / travel / next week.

He **is going to** travel next week.

I think Maria / not come / to school tomorrow.

I think Maria **won't** come to school tomorrow.

Tonight, we / go / to the movies with some friends.

Tonight, we **are going to** go to the movies with some friends.

It / probably / rain / tomorrow.

It **will** probably rain tomorrow.

He has another plan. He / not join / us for dinner tonight.

He has another plan. He **isn't going to** join us for dinner tonight.
