GRAMMAR: Phrasal Verbs

Phrasal verbs are **phrases** that indicate actions. They are generally used in spoken English and informal texts. **Phrasal verbs** consist of a **verb** and a **preposition** or an **adverb**.

Examples:

- *turn down* —> *refuse*
- *come across* —> *find/meet by chance*
- *pass away* —> *die*
- *look for* —> *search*
