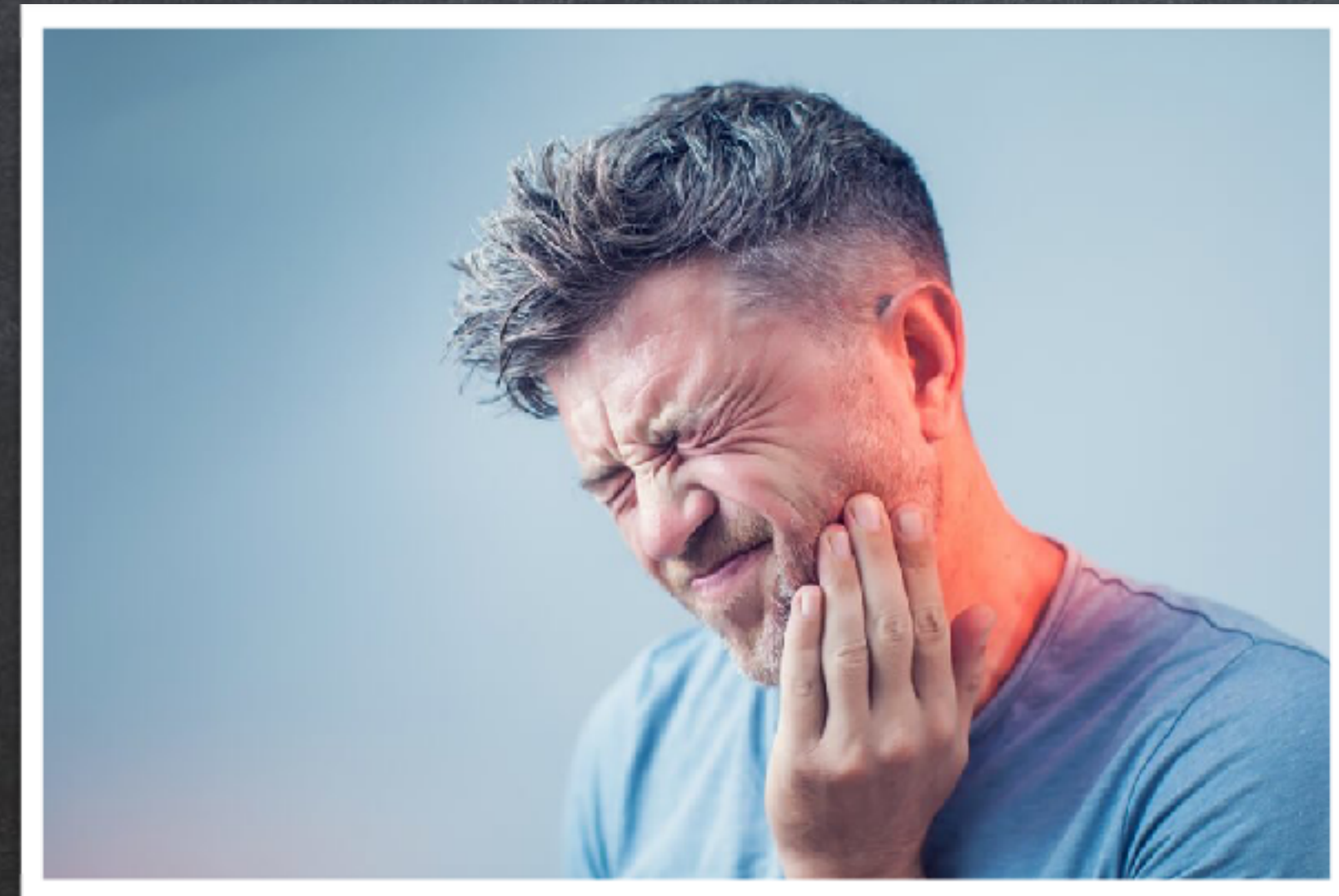


GRAMMAR: Conditional

A: I feel exhausted today.

B: If you're exhausted, go home and relax.



A: I have a terrible toothache.

B: If you have a toothache, you must go to the dentist.

GRAMMAR: Conditional

if + simple present + imperative

- **If you're exhausted, go home and relax.**
- **Go home and relax if you're exhausted.**
- **If you're sick, don't go to school today.**

if + simple present + modals (can, may, must...) + infinitive

- **If you have a toothache, you must go to the dentist.**
- **You must go to the dentist if you have a toothache.**
- **If you're sick, you can stay at home today.**

GRAMMAR: Conditional

Make sentences with if:

1. you - have - a headache - take - an aspirin.
-> **If** you **have** a headache, **take** an aspirin.
2. you - be - sick - you - may - see - a doctor.
3. Sara - feel - bad - she - can - take - a rest.
4. not go - to work - you - have - a terrible flu.
5. he can - call - me - he - need - some help.
