B: I feel terrible. I can't sleep at night.

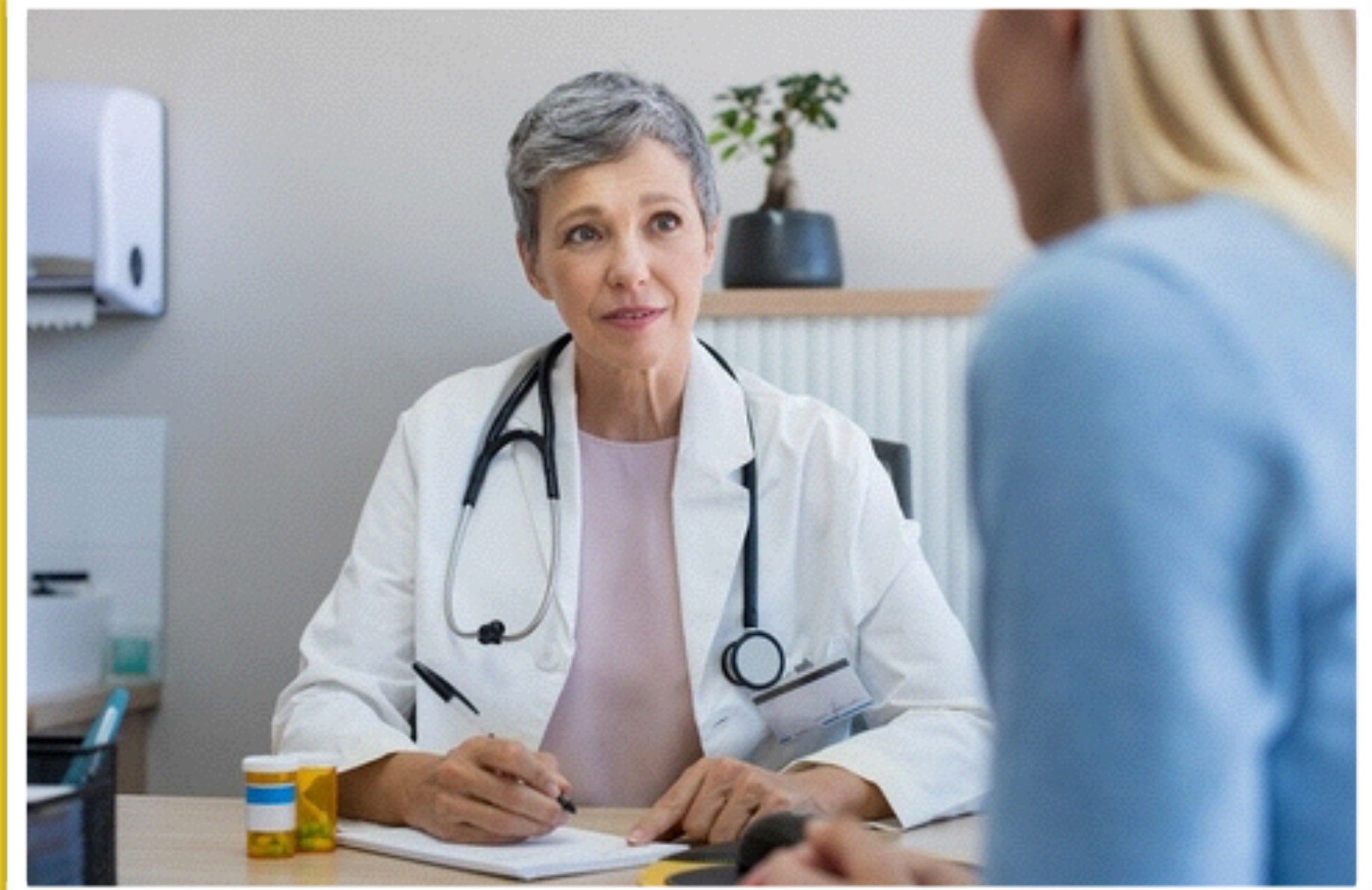
A: Do you drink any coffee or tea before or after dinner?
