Do you speak Spanish?
3. Tom **is chatting** with his friends at the moment. He **is not doing** his homework.
4. The students **are going to go** on a trip next week.
5. I think it **will rain** tomorrow.
6. What **did you do** yesterday?
7. Last weekend I **met** some friends. We **visited** the new mall, but we **didn't stay** there for long.
8. Yesterday evening, Amine **was watching** a movie when the electricity **went off**.
9. I **haven't visited** Paris yet. **Have you ever been** there?

TO BE



S + am/is/are + predicate...



S + am/is/are + not + predicate...



Am/Is/ Are + S + predicate?

VERBS

S + verb + object...

S + don't/doesn't + verb + object...

Do/ Does + S + verb + object?

Tenses Review

Usage

Express general truth

Habits

Example

The sun rises in the east.

I play badminton every Tuesday.



Tenses Review

PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



S + am/is/are + V-ing +....

He is playing.



S + am/is/are (not) + V-ing +....

He isn't playing.



Am/is/are + S + V-ing +...?

Is he playing?

Tenses Review

Usage

Describe something which is happening at the exact moment of speech.

Describe an action that is taking place now but not at the exact moment of speech.

Describe an event planned in the future.

Example

Jim is watching television at the moment.

John is working in London.

I'm taking my French class on Tuesday.

Tenses Review

Simple Future Tense



S+will/shall + V(bare form)

I will go to Thailand.



S + will not/won't + V(Base form)

I will not go to Thailand.



Will + S + V(Base form) +...?

Will you go to Thailand?

Tenses Review

Usage

For actions decided at the moment of speech

For unplanned future actions

Example

I have a toothache. I'll take a medicine.

Winter will come soon.



Tenses Review

PAST SIMPLE TENSE

TO BE



S + Was/were

They were friends.



S + was not/were not + ...

They weren't friends.



Was/Were + S + ...?

Were they friends?

VERBS

S + V-ed

She worked yesterday.

S + did not + verb (base form)

She didn't work yesterday.

Did + S + verb (in base form)?

Did she work yesterday?

Tenses Review

Usage

Example

To express completed action in the past

I saw a ghost last Friday.

To describe a series of completed actions in the past

I finished work, walked to the beach, and found a nice place to swim.

To express habits in the past

When I was young, I watched lots of television every day after school.

Tenses Review

PAST CONTINUOUS TENSE



S + was/were + V-ing

She was cooking all morning.



S + was/were + not + V-ing

She was not sleeping when he came home.



Was/were + S + V-ing?

Was she sleeping when he came home?

Tenses Review

Usage

To describe parallel actions

To describe what someone was doing at a particular point in time

To express interrupted action in the past

Example

While I was washing the dishes, I heard a loud noise.

I was working in the garden all day yesterday.

I was driving to work when I crashed my car.

Tenses Review

Usage

To express things you have done in your life

To describe recently completed actions which are important now

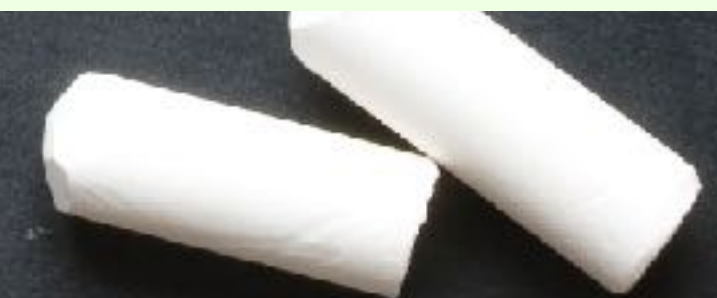
To describe unfinished actions or situations

Example

She has never studied Japanese.

I have some bad news. I've lost my job.

I've known Julie for ten years.



Tenses Review

PRESENT PERFECT TENSE



S + have/has + past participle

I have tried sushi before.



S + have not (haven't)/has not (hasn't) + past participle

I have not tried sushi before.



Have/Has + subject + past participle?

Have you tried sushi before?

Simple Forms	Continuous Forms
Present Simple do / does don't / doesn't	Present Continuous am / is / are doing am not / isn't / aren't doing
Past Simple did didn't do	Past Continuous was / were doing wasn't / weren't doing
Future Simple will do won't do	Future Continuous will be doing won't be doing
Present Perfect Simple have / has done haven't / hasn't done	Present Perfect Continuous have / has been doing haven't / hasn't been doing
