GRAMMAR: Simple Past / Regular Verbs

Last weekend, Sara revised her lessons.

Base Form	Simple Past Form (Affirmative)
revise	revised
clean	cleaned
visit	visited
watch	watched

GRAMMAR: Simple Past / Regular Verbs

Last weekend, Sara **didn't listen** to music.

Base Form	Simple Past Form (Negative)
listen	didn't listen
chat	didn't chat

GRAMMAR: Simple Past / Regular Verbs

Simple Past Statements

Affirmative Forms

- I revised for the test.
- You revised for the test.
- He/she revised for the test.
- We/you/they revised for the test.

Negative Forms

- I didn't revise for the test.
- You didn't revise for the test.
- He/she didn't revise for the test.
- We/you/they didn't revise for the test.
