Present Perfect or Past Simple?

- Sara finished her homework yesterday.
- · I have just finished my homework.
- · Last summer we travelled to London.
- Have you ever travelled to London?



Use the Past Simple for finished past actions.

Sara finished her homework yesterday.

Last summer we travelled to London.

Past Simple Time Markers:

yesterday / last weekend (week, month, year...) / ago.

Use the Present Perfect for finished actions related to the present.

I have just finished my homework.

She has <u>already</u> finished her homework.



Use the Present Perfect for unfinished actions.

I haven't finished my homework <u>yet</u>.

Have you <u>ever</u> travelled to London?

I have <u>never</u> travelled to London.

Present Perfect Time Markers:

already / just / yet / ever / never
